Lyreco is committed to a sustainable approach for doing business across its global operations. Lyreco's promise is to contribute to a sustainable future by working with customers, employees and suppliers towards economic growth, social development and environmental preservation. For Lyreco this means providing the best sustainable services and products in terms of workplace supplies.

Lyreco's sustainable products assessment methodology is based on the internationally recognised ISO 14020 standard. The standard is used to assess products identified as being environmentally preferable. It scores both self claims (e.g. recycled content) and certified claims (e.g. FSC).

Lyreco's environmentally preferable products are identified with the green tree picto in Lyreco's catalogue and website.



'Green Tree Guidelines' per section are briefly presented on the section header page of the Lyreco Catalogue.

'Green Tree Certificates' are available on a link in the product details page on our website which highlight the reasons why the product is environmentally preferable.

Lyreco's key environmental initiatives include:

- Meeting the ISO 14021 environmental assessment standard from 2014; a standard which will bring clarity to all Lyreco's "green tree" products through assessment against the 12 internationally recognised criteria.
- Aiming to increase their "green tree" product range by 10% each year.
- Printing their annual product catalogue on Programme for the Endorsement of Forest Certification (PEFC) chain of custody certified paper since 2012.
- Becoming a member of the Forest Stewardship Council (FSC) in 2011; an organisation committed to the development of environmentally appropriate, socially beneficial and economically viable management of forests in Australia.
- Holding an ongoing certification to ISO 14001 since 2007; demonstrating their focus on understanding the environmental impact of their activities and commitment to putting in place strategic policies to offset their impact.
- Signing up to United Nations Global Compact in 2004; an initiative which provides guidance on increasingly complex risks and opportunities in areas of human rights, labour standards, anti-corruption and environment preservation.
- Reducing greenhouse gas emissions by optimising delivery van schedules to reduce fuel consumption, managing waste and minimising energy consumption.
